
The Psalms: a collection of ancient Hebrew poems, songs and prayers by various writers complied by the people of Israel some time after their exile in Babylon

Served as a form of temple worship for the templeless people God










THE PURPOSE OF (MOST PROBABLY THE TAX COLLECTOR / DISCIPLE) MATTHEW'S GOSPEL IS USUALLY DESCRIBED AS EXPLAINING THE KINGDOM OF GOD, JESUS AS GOD WITH US AND THE PROMISED MESSIAH AND THE CONTINUATION OF THE STORY OF GOD AND HIS PEOPLE

How Jesus used the Psalms to reveal the Kingdom of God

5 Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth.

THE KINGDOM IS AT HAND

Matthew has provided us with the genealogy of Jesus - Davidic (royal) and Abrahamic (promise)

He has given details about His birth and early life, including His exile in and return from Egypt

He has reinforced His Messianic 'credentials' with John the Baptist and the wilderness temptation

'THE SERMON ON THE MOUNT'

THE COUNTER CULTURAL KINGDOM OF GOD IS HERE!

11 But the meek will inherit the land and enjoy peace and prosperity.

MEEKNESS AND MAJESTY

The truth that the meek shall inherit the land had been 'laced' into the wisdom of the people of God

Meekness is definitely not weakness - it requires great strength to resist pride and arrogance

Jesus Himself was 'meek (gentle) and lowly (humble) of heart' (Matt 11:29)

Meekness and majesty, Manhood and deity, In perfect harmony, The Man who is God Lord of eternity, Dwells in humanity, Kneels in humility and washes our feet

Oh what a mystery, Meekness and majesty, Bow down and worship, For this is your God, This is your God

Father's pure radiance, Perfect in innocence, Yet loves obedience, To death on a cross Suffering to give us life, Conquering through sacrifice, And as they crucified prays "Father forgive"

Wisdom unsearchable, God the invisible, Love indestructible, In frailty appears Lord of infinity, Stopping so tenderly, Lifts our humanity to the heights of His throne

23 Then I will tell them plainly, 'I never knew you. Away from me, you evildoers!'

JESUS HAS THE AUTHORITY JUDGE

JUDGE JESUS

We will all, one day, stand before the Lord and face the true, righteous and merciful judge

The previous verse speaks of those who will say they even cast demons out in His name

We shouldn't be enamoured with 'impressive' gifting or ministries - only with knowing Jesus

8 Away from me, all you who do evil, for the Lord has heard my weeping.

SORRY PSALM

Psalm 6 is a 'penitent' psalm of King David 'Evil doers' can be translated as 'workers of lawlessness' - those who choose to go against the ways of The Lord

It should rightly grieve us when our conscience recognises that we have done wrong

115 Away from me, you evildoers, that I may keep the commands of my God!

KEEP HIS COMMANDS

Jesus did not need to say sorry to The Father for any sin or wrongdoing on His own behalf

He is the only human ever to perfectly keep the commands of the Lord

When Jesus used this quote it was to distinguish those who understood His kingdom

What really matters is knowing Jesus and being known by Him

16 "Do you hear what these children are saying?" they asked him. "Yes," replied Jesus, "have you never read, "From the lips of children and infants you, Lord, have called forth your praise'?"

JESUS ACCEPTS PRAISE AS 'LORD' FROM THOSE CONSIDERED THE LEAST

2 Through the praise of children and infants you have established a stronghold against your enemies, to silence the foe and the

OUT OF THE MOUTHS OF BABES!

God's kingdom again is revealed to be counterintuitive to the normal way of the world

Through Christ's example and grace, God's strength is made perfect in our weakness (2 Cor 12:9)

Do you hear what those children were saying?!

42 Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures: "'The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; the Lord has done this, and it is marvellous in our eyes'

CHRIST ALONE, CORNERSTONE

The content is when Jesus is sharing the parable of the tenants - challenging the Pharisees

Jesus knew that His own put would reject Him and put Him to death

He also knew that He was to become our salvation and the foundation of our faith

22 The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; 23 the Lord has done this, and it is marvellous in our eyes.

As the Psalmist thanked God for His salvation, so do we! Even more-so!

44" 'The Lord said to my Lord: "Sit at my right hand until I put your enemies under your feet." '

1 The Lord says to my lord: a "Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet."

ANY FURTHER QUESTIONS?!!

Jesus directly quoted King David here to challenge the Pharisees and literally shut them up!

They were awaiting the Messiah who they knew would be descended from King David

Jesus asked them how it could be that David would call him Lord if he is one of his sons...

BARARAG.

HAVING ALREADY AFFIRMED THE VOICE OF THE LEAST, JESUS NOW SILENCES THE POWER HUNGRY RELIGIOUS ELITE!

39 For I tell you, you will not see me again until you say, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.'

WHOA!

This comes at the end of the 'seven woes' Jesus gives as a warning to the teachers of the law

The reference to Psalm 118:26 is either related to the 'Triumphal Entry' or the coming second advent of Jesus, or both!

One day every tongue shall confess Jesus is Lord

26 Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. From the house of the Lord we bless you.

Blessed is Jesus - the one who comes in the Name of The Lord

46 About three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, lemasabachthani?" (which means "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?").

1 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from saving me, so far from my cries of anguish?

HE WHO BECAME SIN FOR US

The final time in Matthew's gospel where Jesus is recorded as quoting a psalm

In the pain and anguish that He experienced as He took the punishement for our sin upon that cross, psalm 22 was one of the things He cried out

Jesus experienced the fullness of human suffering

BUT NOT THE END OF THE STORY!

JESUS AND THE PSALMS IN MATTHEW HELP US TO RECOGNISE JESUS - HIS MISSION, HIS SUFFERING, HIS SALVATION, HIS KINGDOM
